Grade Point Average (GPA) and Rank

Grade point average is calculated at the end of each semester (twice a year) on a 4.0 scale. For students beginning ninth grade in 2015-16, honors courses receive an additional 0.5 weight, while AP and Career & College Promise courses receive an additional 1.0 weight.

Due to COVID-19, our school district moved to remote learning on March 16, 2020. For final passing grades, students could choose between their final number grades or "PC-19." Students received credit for "PC-19," and their GPAs were NOT impacted. For final grades below a 60, students received "WC-19." Students did not receive credit for "WC-19," and their GPAs were NOT impacted.
