It satisfies electives using both Latin and Greek, some at the advanced level, along with both literature history surveys. Students can also satisfy electives with less language, literature and history by choosing from among courses listed in the catalog entry for the concentration.

12 s.h. of Writing Intensive (WI) courses must be completed, typically including ENGL 1100, ENGL 2201; at least 3 s.h. in the major and an additional WI of the student's choice.

A 3 s.h. Global Diversity course and a 3 s.h. Domestic Diversity course are also required (these can coincide with other general education or major courses)
