PSYC 4312 may not be repeated. ***NEUR 4950/4951 are carried out only during the senior year.</i>
<i>****PSYC 4250 (must be Dr. Tran's section: Advanced Topics – Neurobiology of Learning and Memory).</i>
<i>NEUR 4900 is a third capstone option but is not offered anymore until further notice.</i>
